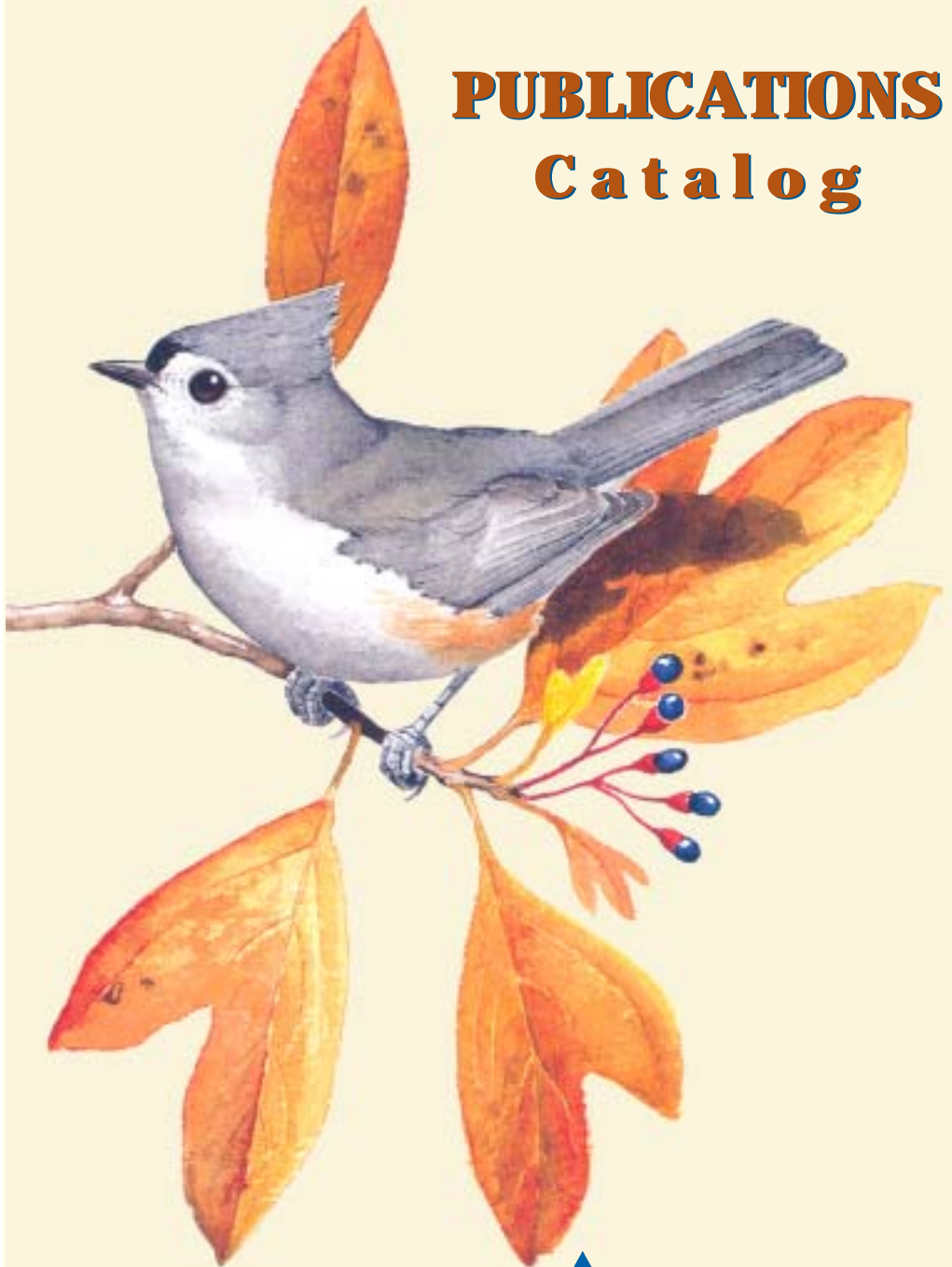

## Massachusetts Breeding Bird Atlas

Edited by Wayne R. Petersen and W. Roger Meservey

Illustrated by John Sill and Barry W. Van Dusen



In 1974, the Massachusetts Audubon Society and the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife launched a statewide five-year survey to map the distribution of the breeding birds of the Commonwealth—the first such comprehensive effort in North America. During this period, hundreds of volunteers spent countless hours in the field, ultimately confirming 198 breeding species.

This atlas is the published record of that survey. It contains distribution maps showing “possible,” “probable,” or “confirmed” breeding records for Massachusetts’ nesting species. Every full species account is accompanied by an accurate and beautiful watercolor portrait.

This volume provides, in an accessible format, a baseline record against which changes in the status of Massachusetts breeding birds can be measured. (2003) Hardcover. 441 pp.

The Massachusetts Breeding Bird Atlas includes the following information:

- One hundred ninety-eight grid maps depicting the distribution of the Commonwealth’s breeding birds.
- Full-page accounts for all species “confirmed” during the Atlas period, including historical perspective; relative abundance; habitat; seasonal schedule; song; nest; and egg descriptions, clutch size, egg dates, number of broods; and other pertinent details.
- A set of eight transparent overlay maps allowing users to correlate key environmental factors with the distribution of nesting species.
- Full-color portraits of all “confirmed” species by award-winning nature artists John Sill and Barry W. Van Dusen.
- Introductory sections describing the Atlas survey methodology and discussing key aspects of breeding bird distribution in Massachusetts.
- An appendix describing bird species known to breed in Massachusetts before and/or after, but not during, the Atlas period.

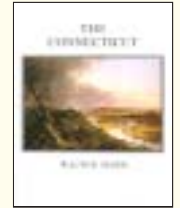

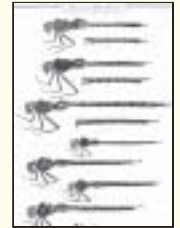

For more than fifty years, Wildwood has welcomed boys and girls to the outdoors. Summer after summer, campers discover the wonders of nature at Wildwood. They learn about the environment, and go home inspired and empowered to care for the world.

Located among the gently rolling hills of southern New Hampshire on a pristine pond, Wildwood's residential campers enjoy the feeling of being out in the wilderness while being just 90 minutes from Boston. Here, the sun soaks into the sandy swimming area and gentle breezes send sailboats across the pond. Nestled within the trees, the craft shop and play field await campers' creative spirits and boundless energies. In the evening, stories and songs are shared around a campfire circle while viewing the sunset over the pond. With miles of trails to wander, campers never run out of paths to explore with their counselors.
