

**The Blue Hills Trailside Museum** is a small natural history museum situated at the base of Great Blue Hill, owned by the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) and managed by Mass Audubon.

We feature educational programs, exhibits that focus on the local natural history and displays of our native, non-releasable animals.

The museum provides a convenient introduction to your Blue Hills exploration. We are open Friday-Sunday and most Monday holidays from 10 a.m.- 5 p.m. Programs may be scheduled any day of the week.

Take Route 128/93 to exit 2B Milton. Follow 138 North for 1/2 mile. You will see our large parking lot on the right. For more information call 617-333-0690 x227.
