The camp fee includes a \$50 enrollment fee per child per session which is non-refundable. Refunds are not made for dismissal, failure to attend, absence or sick days. THE HIGHLAND CENTER

The 110-acre Highlands Center at Cape Cod National Seashore is situated on a high bluff overlooking the North Atlantic Ocean in North Truro. The converging land and sea habitats provide a fitting backdrop for the center, which is envisioned to be a place of learning, reflection and research.



Natural History Day Camp

For children entering Grades 2–5

The Truro Natural History Day Camp is designed to promote a child's lasting curiosity, to instill awareness and appreciation of the natural world, and to promote an understanding of our place in nature. Camp activities are carefully planned to meet these goals and at the same time create a fun and memorable experience.



Campers will be met each day at The Highland Center in Truro by their two Mass Audubon instructors. The group of 10–16 campers will travel off-site to various conservation lands in the area for a day of exploration and discovery.

Each day the group will travel to one of these locations in Truro or Provincetown for exploration, field investigations, and wildlife discovery:

- Highland Light
- Village Pond
- Pilgrim Heights



STAFF: Our staff are chosen for their experience working with children in the outdoors, their enthusiasm for and knowledge of natural history and field research, and their familiarity with outdoor recreation techniques and safety. They are college graduates in an environmental/biological and/or educational field. Each participates in a 10-day pre-camp training and is certified in CPR and First Aid.



Camper Expectations: Due to the outdoor and exploratory nature of this program, participants must be able to move on uneven terrain, are expected to take part in age appropriate activities and follow stated behavior expectations and safety rules. At any time parents may request copies of background checks, health care and discipline policies, and procedures for filing grievances.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Registration Policy: All registrations will be accepted by phone, mail, in person. They will be stamped with the date of receipt and processed on a first come, first-served basis. Registration must be accompanied by a credit card number or a check for 50% of the cost of camp. The camp fee includes a \$50 non-refundable enrollment fee per session per child. For identity safety assurances, fax and email submissions are not accepted.

Deadline: The balance of the camp fee is due on May 1. If payment is not received by May 1 then your space is no longer guaranteed. No camper is allowed in camp unless all forms, waivers, and payments are complete. If registering after May 1 your registration must be accompanied by a credit card number or check for the full amount of camp.

Transfer Policy: Transfers are allowed before May 1 without penalty. Any transfer requested after May 1 will incur a \$25 transfer fee per session per child.

Important Health Information: Massachusetts state law requires all campers to submit, every year, completed health forms supplied by the camp and a copy of current immunization record. A health form packet will be sent upon registration and all pages must be completed and returned 2 weeks before the start of the child's first camp session. If we do not receive health forms by this date, you will incur a \$25 late fee for each child. **Your child can only attend camp if we have all necessary health forms, waivers, and payments. No exceptions.** This camp must comply with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (105 CMR 430) and be licensed by the Wellfleet Board of Health. Cape Cod Resident Discount: Receive \$30 discount per week per child with written proof of enrollment in a Cape Cod school district. Be sure to attach this to your registration form.
