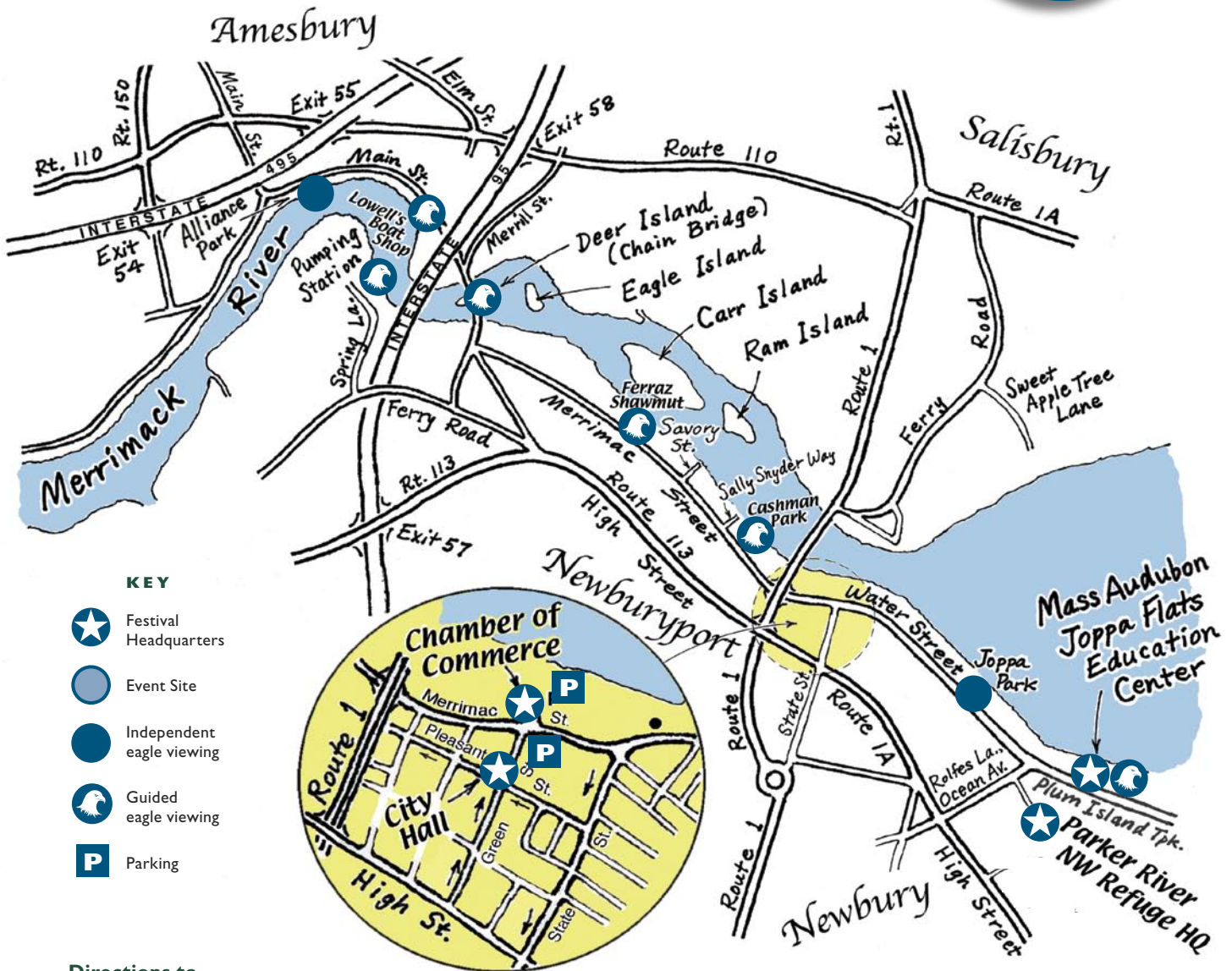


Eagle Festival map

From Route 95, take Exit 57 (Route 113) and follow signs to downtown Newburyport.

SOME HINTS WHILE LOOKING FOR EAGLES

Bald Eagles are most likely to be found around open fresh water. Only adults have the distinctive white heads, but immatures have the same impressive size and wingspan of up to eight feet. Look for Bald Eagles soaring in the sky or perched in tall trees overlooking open water. Please be respectful of private property and parking regulations.

ADDITIONAL SITES: While you're in the area, you may want to see other exciting winter wildlife.

- at Salisbury Beach State Reservation: in Salisbury, follow Route 1A north to the state reservation and look for Short-eared Owls, Rough-legged Hawks, loons, seaducks, and maybe even a Snowy Owl.
- at the north end of Plum Island: if it's mid- or low-tide, continue east beyond the Joppa Flats Education Center to Plum Island. Follow the road as it goes left on Northern Boulevard and go to the end to see seals on the rocks in the Merrimack River between Plum Island and the Salisbury Beach State Reservation.
