

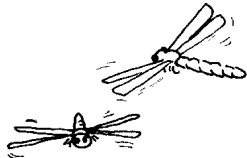
Learning is always fun at Moose Hill!

Maple Sugaring Programs

Weekday Sugaring Scout Walks (1.5 hours)

Weekdays, late February - late March 2011

Join us for the magic of maple sugaring. Discover why this is the right time to make maple syrup. Learn about the natural and cultural history of sugaring from original Native American methods up to present day technology. Come inside our sugar house and see the inner workings of our evaporator. (Please note that the evaporator may not be lit during these programs.) A taste of the final product will complete your program.

Weekend Special Event (1.5 hours)

Maple Sugaring Festival 2011

Weekend dates in March 13, 19, and 20
11 a.m. - 3 p.m., tours begin every 15 minutes

This special event weekend (available to everyone) features the wonders of maple sugaring. Learn about maple trees and why this is the right time to sugar. Visit with people dressed from and speaking about colonial and Native American sugaring practices. After experiencing the sweet steam from our sugar house, where we are turning sap into syrup, enjoy a sample of our pure maple syrup.

Other treats ("sap" dogs, pancakes with syrup, maple popcorn and more) will be available back at the Nature Center for a small additional fee. Additional free activities are offered back at the Nature Center too to complete the experience!

Evening Programs

Discuss nocturnal wildlife, constellations, night vision, and night hiking skills during an evening program. Experiences may include calling for owls, listening for singing choruses of spring peepers and other frogs, viewing spectacular firefly shows, and enjoying other seasonal highlights. These evening programs are offered weekends and weekday evenings. The evening rate applies to programs scheduled outside our regular office hours. (1.5 hours)

Pre-registration is required for all programs.

Weekday Maple Sugaring Fees

One chaperone is free for every five children. Any additional adults pay the child rate.

Maple Sugaring Festival: Special Event Fees

\$7/person

Pre-registration is required. The event fee is applied to both children and adults. Children age three and younger are free.

Moose Hill Wildlife Sanctuary

Moose Hill Wildlife Sanctuary, located in Sharon and established in 1916, is the oldest Massachusetts Audubon Society sanctuary and one of the oldest private wildlife sanctuaries in the United States. Moose Hill protects nearly 2,000 acres of forests, fields and wetland habitats. The Sanctuary offers a wide variety of programs and services for children, adults, families, schools, scouts and community groups. The office and gift shop is open weekdays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m and weekends from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Members hike for free. The trail fee for non-members is \$4 for adults and \$3 for children and seniors. Children three and under are free. For more information about membership, programs, and other events call 781-784-5691.
