

School & Group Pricing

- At the Sanctuary (guided hike):
Each group (max. 20) is \$50 per hour with a limit of 5 groups per day.
- Off Site: (a hike or in the classroom):
Each group (max. 25) is \$80 per hour.
For additional groups on the same day & at the same location it is \$60 per hour.

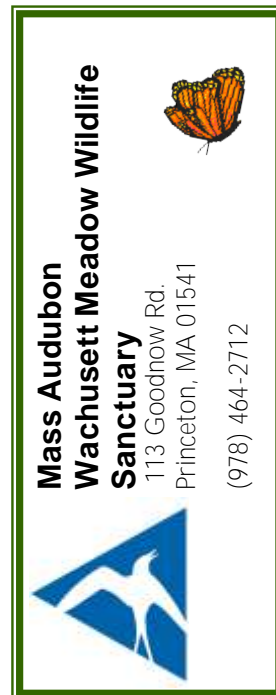
Mass Audubon

Guided Walks

Wachusett Meadow welcomes & encourages school & community groups to visit the sanctuary, explore its trails & learn about the plants, animals, ecology, & the habitats that occur here. Our naturalist guided field trips last at least one hour. Instructors involve children in activities designed to teach information and awareness about the natural environment. If a group is studying a specific theme in the classroom, teachers may request that the walk relate to that topic. We can also come to your school with an in the classroom program or hike!



Wachusett Meadow Wildlife Sanctuary

Wachusett Meadow Wildlife Sanctuary is a Mass Audubon sanctuary protecting 1,200 acres of wildlife habitat in Princeton, MA.

Twelve miles of trails include such highlights as an 80-acre beaver pond alive with beaver, mink, otter, wood ducks & **herons**. **The sanctuary's 1300 ft. summit** offers excellent hawk watching as well.



Possible Themes

Meadow Life: Discover life cycles, life criteria, seasonal changes & biodiversity by observing the plants & animals in the meadows.

Forest Discovery: Explore the woods & observe plants & animals of that habitat.

Insects: Learn about insects & how they relate to the food chain. Are they the predator or the prey? What are their life cycles?

Animal Signs: Become a detective and look for clues that tell us who was here & what they were doing.

Ponding/vernal Pools: Life in the water. Learn about its diversity as an ecosystem.

Sensory Awareness: Our five tools that are always with us will be used as we travel through different habitats on the sanctuary.

We are also happy to work with teachers and groups to create a program that best meets their needs.
