### July 24-26: Extreme Outdoors

How far can you go and how fast can you get there? This week, you'll bike the legendary Provincelands, trek through the High Head dunes, and kayak and snorkel in Nauset Marsh. *Participants must have prior experience kayaking, snorkeling, and riding bikes with gears.*



### August 7-9: Survivor Cape Cod

Can you survive an action-packed adventure? This week, you'll go on a fishing adventure, set up an orienteering course at our sanctuary, and kayak and snorkel in beautiful Pleasant Bay. *Participants must have prior experience kayaking and snorkeling.*



### August 21-23: On the Water

Would you rather be on the water than on land? This week, you'll go on a whale watch, canoe in one of Cape Cod's kettle ponds, and snorkel off the Provincetown breakwater. *Participants must have prior experience canoeing and snorkeling.*



**STAFF:** Our staff are chosen for their experience working with teens, enthusiasm for and knowledge of natural history, and familiarity with outdoor recreation techniques and safety. They are college graduates in an environmental/biological science and/or education field. Each participates in a 10-day pre-camp training and is certified in CPR, First Aid, and is Lifeguard Certified.

### Cape Cod Resident Discount

Campers who reside on Cape Cod receive \$40 discount per week per child with proof of enrollment in a Cape Cod school district. **A copy of a report card, progress report, or letter from the school must accompany your registration or you will not receive the discount.** Please contact the day camp director if you have any questions. To qualify for Cape Cod resident discounts you must be a current Mass Audubon member at the Family level or above and be the parent, grandparent, or legal guardian of the enrolled camper. To check member status please call Member Services at 781-259-9500.

### Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available for those who may need it. Please call to request an application. All applications are due by May 4, 2012. All applicants must supply verification of income or documentation that financial assistance is needed. Please contact the day camp director with questions about necessary

**REFUND AND CANCELLATION POLICY:** *All cancellations must be received in writing.* The program fee includes a non-refundable \$50 enrollment fee per child, per session. A session is defined as a Tuesday-Thursday program. There will be no refunds for dismissal, failure to attend, absence, or sick days. If you cancel for any reason before the start of your child's program session, the amount of tuition refund is determined by the following schedule.

- 60+ days in advance-100% refund (less \$50 enrollment fee)
- 14-59 days in advance-50% refund (less \$50 enrollment fee)
- Fewer than 14 days in advance-no refunds



Due to the outdoor and exploratory nature of this program, participants must be able to move on uneven terrain, are expected to take part in age appropriate activities and follow stated behavior expectations and safety rules. At any time parents may request copies of background checks, health care and discipline policies, and procedures for filing grievances.
