Park in the parking lot and walk along the crushed stone path to the visitor center.

There is an automatic door opener on the right.





The first stop is the Visitor Services desk at the Nature Center. You will be greeted at the desk, given a map of the trails, and find out about upcoming programs and what other visitors have seen recently.

While you are in the building, you can use our restrooms which have composting toilets—these may seem different from your toilet at home because they do not use water or a flush handle.

The drinking fountain is also a filling station if you bring your own water bottle.

At times there may be muddy areas of trails.

Over ½ mile of trail is wide, covered in crushed stone, and accessible to most people.



There are many different types of wildlife living on the sanctuary.
