

Scout Programs at Tidmarsh Wildlife Sanctuary

Programs are designed for hands-on discoveries and allow scouts to work together to gain an appreciation for the natural world. We offer many programs to fit your troop/dens needs. If you don't see what you're looking for in our brochure please call and we would be happy to work with you to develop a specific program.

Program Fees

Journey and Badge Programs \$6/Child
These programs run for 1.5hrs and help the scouts meet their badge requirements, please see inside for various badge programs. There is a minimum charge of \$60 per program. Chaperones are free.

Scout Night Hikes \$7/Child
When the sun goes down, the Sanctuary wakes up! Learn how animals (and people) use their senses at night. We'll play some fun games and find out how and why our eyes adjust to the dark. Each night hike is 1.5hrs. There is a minimum charge of \$70 for this program.

Scout Owl Prowls \$8/child
Join us for an evening to learn about owls and their habitats. We'll have an informative presentation with hands on activities. Then head out on the trails to listen for evidence of our feathery friends. The program runs 1.5 hrs with an \$80 minimum.

A vast expanse of cold-water streams, ponds, forest, and woodlands, Tidmarsh is a 481-acre landscape permanently protected and open for all to enjoy. Once a working cranberry farm, this landscape underwent the largest freshwater ecological restoration ever completed in the Northeast.

Its previous owners, the Schulman Family, along with the Massachusetts Division of Ecological Restoration, U.S. Department of Agriculture's NRCS and many other organizations, re-created over three miles of stream channel, sculpted the land's surface, and removed nine dams connecting the headwaters of Beaver Dam Brook to the ocean for the first time in more than a century.

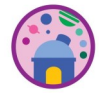
