


Directions

From the Mass Pike – Exit 11, Millbury and go left onto Route 122 north, then left onto Route 20 west. Turn right at traffic light onto Massasoit Road.

From I 290 – Exit 14, Route 122 south. Bear right at rotary staying on Route 122. At five-street intersection, bear right onto Massasoit Road.

Broad Meadow Brook Conservation Center and Wildlife Sanctuary

Found in the southeastern corner of Worcester, the Sanctuary protects the nature of Massachusetts through its active schedule of educational programs, grassroots and legislative advocacy, and ecological research activities. Serving Worcester County and the Blackstone River Valley, Broad Meadow Brook reaches out to communities, schools, and residents, working to improve the quality of our environment and conserve natural resources.

Opened to the public in 1991, Broad Meadow Brook has a land base of more than 430 acres of woodlands, fields, wetlands and streams, which support a broad variety of wildlife species.

Animal Habitats

Learn about wild animals on the sanctuary and investigate an animal habitat. 

Flowers

Draw a favorite flower and learn about flower parts. Take a flower walk and learn medicinal uses of three common sanctuary flowers.

BOY SCOUTS

Wolf Cubs

Paws on the Path 2 hours

Learn how to hike safely. Go on a hike to identify birds, insects, and other animals that we find on our sanctuary.

Bears

Furs, Feathers, & Ferns 2 hours

Visit our sanctuary and take a 1-mile hike to identify signs of wildlife. Learn about extinction and what animals have become extinct.

Webelos

Into the Wild 2 hours

Learn about bird migrations and identify birds. Hike the sanctuary to observe animals in the wild. Visit an aquatic ecosystem and learn why they are so important. 

Into the Woods 2 hours

Learn to identify six forest trees and six forest plants and discover why these are useful to wildlife. Discuss the effects of wildfires and how trees receive nutrients and grow.

Earth Rocks! 2½ hours

Learn about the three rock types, mineral testing, and why rocks are so important to our everyday life.

Come and experience a nighttime hike on our trails. Have lots of fun with night vision sensory experiments. Depending on the theme you choose, you will learn about the natural history of owls or frogs.
