


Visiting the North River Wildlife Sanctuary



Gaining Entrance to the Sanctuary

The main building may be the first stop on your visit. Here you will check-in at the front desk, get a map of the Sanctuary, and talk with your guardian about what you might do at the Sanctuary that day.





Getting Around

The sanctuary is big and can include a lot of walking on different walking surfaces such as: crushed gravel, roots, rocks, and boardwalks. The boardwalks might be slippery if it's wet outside. The sanctuary is home for wildlife, please treat with respect by staying on trails and observing from afar. Will see more if you are quiet.

Places to Visit: Overview

At the North River Sanctuary, there are many different areas to explore including: a nature play area, a Sensory Trail, a brook, an observation deck, a Discovery Room, and a gift shop. Other buildings you might see on the property are not open to visitors.



Places to Visit: Nature Play Area

You may see others playing in the Nature Play area. Please share the activities with the other visitors you see using this area.

Places to Visit: Trails

If you choose to explore the trails, you may have to cross a road. The cars driving by are loud and fast and it is important to stay with your guardian when crossing the street.



Places to Visit: Discovery Room

There are many different things to touch and explore in the Discovery Room. Here you can listen to and watch birds at the feeders, as well as other small animals, with binoculars. There may be others enjoying this area. Please be kind and share items in this space.



Places to Visit: Gift Shop

At the end of your visit, you may decide to visit the gift shop. It is important to ask your guardian's permission before handling any of the merchandise for sale.
