Naturalist Guided Field Walks

TIDAL FLAT EXPLORATION

We will explore the shore to discover creatures and uncover their secrets for survival in an environment inundated twice daily by the tide.

BIRDING FOR BEGINNERS 1.5 hours | \$160

know, What's that bird, this walk offers skills on how to recognize birds through color, shape, size, markings, songs, and behavior.

BIRDING POPPONESSET SPIT 1.5 hours | \$160

In this short stretch of narrow and exposed barrier beach along the southern coast of Cape Cod, you will stroll over the sands in search of terns, endangered piping plovers and their relatives.

TRACKING ON SANDY NECK 1.5 hours | \$160

Search trails and dunes for clues to the wildlife that inhabits this remarkable ecosystem. We may discover tracks and signs of creatures including coyote, fox, raccoon, shorebirds, and Diamondback Terrapin Turtles.

NATURE KAYAKINGSTAND U2.5 hours | \$600 for up to 12 peopleNATURE


Kayaking offers a unique and intimate connection to wildlife that is truly memorable. Choose from some of the Cape's most pristine waterways including Barnstable Harbor's Great Marsh, Sandy Neck barrier beach, the Herring River, Chase Garden Creek and Sampson's Island. Kayaks, paddles and life vests provided. Paddlers age 16-18 must be in a boat with an adult. All must have good swimming ability and prior kayak experience.

STAND UP AND EXPLORE

2 hours | \$200 for up to 5 people

Join our naturalist guides for a stand up paddle board experience. Trips can be catered to your group from learn to paddle board lesson on one of the Cape's calm glacial kettle ponds- to a more adventurous tidal creek paddle for those with prior experience. Boards, paddles and life vests provided. Paddlers must be over 18 years of age and have good swimming ability.

RAPTORS


This presentation will guide you in identification of raptors and describe the amazing migration adaptions raptors rely on to survive.
