# Fiscal Year 2020 Highlights


Mass Audubon remains a strong and financially stable organization despite a number of economic challenges brought on by the pandemic. Like many nonprofits, we were forced to make some dramatic changes to our operating model, which resulted in significant revenue losses due to program closures and cancellations.

Within this reality, we had to make many difficult financial decisions including the painful need to lay off staff. We also drew on reserves and endowment resources to make onetime investments that helped bridge the gap to the future.


The loyalty and generosity of our members and supporters profoundly bolstered our work and helped maintain the financial stability of our operating budget, and an additional \$4.6 million was raised for capital projects, land acquisitions, and special projects across the state. Investment income was at an all-time high, due to diligent management of our endowment funds and a positive stock market. As a result, Mass Audubon realized a smaller operating deficit in FY 2020 than anticipated.

Mass Audubon continues to face significant financial impacts of the pandemic in 2021. However, we will respond with innovation, flexibility, and continued determination, and we will count on the enthusiastic support from our members, donors, and program partners as we navigate this year and beyond.

# A Pivotal Pandemic

Like many organizations, the global coronavirus pandemic hit Mass Audubon hard. In an effort to keep both staff and the public safe, we temporarily closed our wildlife sanctuaries and halted in-person programs.

But that didn't stop our dedicated staff from coming up with innovative ways to connect with people across the state. We quickly launched Explore Nature at Home, which included videos, activity sheets, and virtual programs. We reimagined Bird-a-thon, our annual fundraising and birding competition, to become Bird-at-home-a-thon, which raised a record-breaking \$350,000.

With schools still in session, our educators provided online lessons for K-12 students in classrooms across the state, and our licensed preschools continued meeting remotely.

As the statewide restrictions lifted, we reopened our trails, welcoming back people of all ages and abilities to connect with nature.

Once summer arrived, 3,725 campers safely attended 11 day camps, much to the delight of parents and the kids. "Camp was the best week we've had since COVID closed schools in March, no exaggeration!" said one camp family. And for those families not ready to return in person, our Nature Inside Out Virtual Camp beamed into campers' homes each week, virtual campouts and all.

All the while our educators ran small, in-person programs for adults and families, our visitor services staff welcomed visitors to our sanctuaries (many for the first time), our property managers kept our trails and sanctuaries in pristine shape, and staff worked tirelessly from home and work offices ensuring that all operations continued to run without a hitch.

Of course, even with all of this work, the economic impacts of COVID ran deep. Budget shortfalls led to a reduction of staff that was painful yet necessary. With the continued support of our members and partners, we can take the lessons learned from COVID and emerge as a stronger, more resilient organization.

# Successes Across the State

Thanks to our members, supporters, partners, and dedicated staff, we were able to accomplish a tremendous amount during Fiscal Year 2020.

Here are just a few highlights of this work.

# Statewide

The Mass Audubon Youth Climate Leadership Program hosted six Youth Climate Summits across the state, which brought together more than 400 young people. This youth-led, action-oriented climate immersion program offers students the opportunity to learn about climate change, network with experts, and implement youth-led climate action solutions throughout their schools and communities.

The Conservation Science and Advocacy team worked together to publish Losing Ground: Nature's Value in a Changing Climate. The sixth edition of this report analyzes land use patterns in Massachusetts, highlighting the value of forests, farmlands, and wetlands for climate resilience.

The Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation awarded Mass Audubon a contract worth a minimum of \$450,000 over three years to develop and promote climate-smart forestry programs through forest stewardship planning on private lands and carbon sequestration on municipal lands. This project will also ensure that forest management practices are appropriate for changing climate conditions to safeguard water, wildlife habitat, and forest carbon stocks.

We honored retiring President Gary Clayton by establishing the Gary Clayton Fund for Innovation in Conservation and Climate Action. Funded through the support of governance members and many friends of Mass Audubon, this will provide critical support for cutting-edge work in conservation and climate science and education.



# Berkshires & Connecticut River Valley

Pleasant Valley in Lenox celebrated its 90th anniversary with special events, including the "Birds, Blossoms, and Brunch" fundraiser that raised more than \$32,000 to launch the Lenox Garden Club Education Endowment to support the Berkshire Environmental Literacy Program.

Arcadia in Easthampton/Northampton completed construction on a new outdoor Teaching Pavilion to allow for expansion of camp, nature, and climate education programs in the years to come.

Mass Audubon acquired a Conservation Restriction (CR) on a former golf course in Northampton. Purchased in February by the City of Northampton, the property adds 105 acres to the southwestern section of a large forested area known as the Rocky Hill Greenway.

# Central

The completed design and pending completion of Wachusett Meadow's All Persons Trail in Princeton brings Mass Audubon's total of ADA-compliant nature trails to 13. Some final work is now being done to prepare the trail for visitors, protect nearby wetlands, and complete the planning and installation of the experiential overlay of the universally designed interpretive tour and production of trail materials in large print, braille, and audio formats.

Broad Meadow Brook in Worcester established the Holdrege Caretaker House as a home base for a new Intern-in-Residence Program, which hosts aspiring conservation leaders over the course of a semester, school year, or summer while working at the sanctuary on relevant ecological and environmental education projects and assisting with the wildlife sanctuary's operations.





# North Shore

Ipswich River in Topsfield built a new bird garden that uses native plants to attract more insects and birds, and expanded existing grassland habitat by five acres, which it hopes will attract declining species such as Bobolinks and American Kestrels.

# **Metro West**

Drumlin Farm in Lincoln collaborated with local hunger relief organizations to provide healthy produce for vulnerable families in our community. They raised more than \$80,000 to donate farm-grown produce and eggs to people in need across Eastern Massachusetts.

Broadmoor completed its Preserving the Path Campaign, which is funding an ambitious project to restore and relocate its trail system so that trails are more resistant to climate change and more accessible.

# **Boston**

Boston Nature Center (BNC) in Mattapan saw its Willow Tree Youth Leaders launch the Better Bottle Project campaign after attending a Mass Audubon Youth Climate Summit. They provide one partner school's middle-graders with recyclable water bottles to replace single-use plastic bottles.

# Metro South

The Museum of American Bird Art (MABA) in Canton was awarded a two-year Institute of Museum and Library Services grant to build The Nest, a nature makerspace, design workshop, and art studio.

Moose Hill in Sharon partnered with Boston Nature Center to bring organic farm produce to Mattapan. In addition to using BNC as a community supported agriculture (CSA) pick-up location, Moose Hill also attended the Mattapan Square Farmers Market and started a Sunday Farm Stand Pop-up at BNC. Customers in both Mattapan and Sharon can also now pay with SNAP/HIP benefits as well as WIC/Senior coupons.







# South East

Tidmarsh in Plymouth broke ground on the next phase of the sanctuary's restoration project. In partnership with the Town of Plymouth (and many others), Tidmarsh removed two dams and restored the natural flow of West Beaver Dam Brook.

Mass Audubon worked with partners from the Resilient Taunton Watershed Network and the communities of Freetown, Lakeville, Middleborough, New Bedford, Rochester, and Taunton to advance climate resilience management actions around the Assawompset Pond Complex for reducing local flooding issues, improving water quality, and enhancing recreational access.

# Cape Cod

Wellfleet Bay in South Wellfleet completed the renovation of Goose Pond Trail, repairing the aging dam and bulkhead and replacing the decking on the bridge and viewing platform of the All Persons Trail.

Long Pasture in Barnstable completed its comprehensive capital campaign, raising more than \$1.8 million for the new Discovery Center. Currently under construction, this building will enable the sanctuary to offer even more programs that cultivate environmental literacy in engaging, compelling, hands-on ways.

The Coastal Waterbird Team completed a major beach renourishment project on Dead Neck/Sampsons Island in Barnstable, relocating sand to support navigation, buffer storms, and provide habitat for nesting birds.

# Martha's Vineyard

Felix Neck in Edgartown held its first Sanctuary
Supper in August 2019. During this "Eat for the Planet"
fundraiser, friends were treated to an extraordinary
plant-based meal, a stunning sunset, and the
camaraderie of a community that cares about the
island and Mass Audubon's work to protect it.

# Land Conservation Summary Fiscal Year 2020

With the support of generous individuals, foundations, families, businesses, communities, and public and private conservation partners, Mass Audubon protected 712 acres of important land across Massachusetts, raising our total conserved acreage to 38,713 acres. This land serves as important habitat for plants and animals, protects our clean drinking water and fresh air, enhances our physical and mental health, provides places to experience the joys of nature, and enables all living things to be more resilient to the increasing impacts of climate change. # GIFTS OF CONSERVATION RESTRICTIONS

PINE GROVE 105 acres
Northampton Arcadia

The **City of Northampton** purchased this former golf course with a vision to work with Mass Audubon to rewild the property, boosting resilience for nature and people in the process. It abuts the large forested southwestern section of the City's Rocky Hill Greenway conservation area and is an exciting opportunity to reforest the degraded watershed and restore the natural shape and function of the Nashawannuck Brook.

68 acres

Duxbury

North Hill Marsh

The **Town of Duxbury** acquired this land with the help of Community Preservation Act funds and asked Mass Audubon to hold the required Conservation Restriction (CR). In addition to conserving critical habitat for rare and endangered species, these parcels complete the protection of all the land directly surrounding North Hill Marsh Wildlife Sanctuary.

CARVER Lenox 70 acres

Pleasant Valley

This CR was donated to Mass Audubon by David Carver, who owns land abutting The Mount, Edith Wharton's home and a National Historic Landmark. Mass Audubon has partnered with **The Mount** for the past two years, providing free bird walks for the public that extended onto Mr. Carver's land. Now, thanks to his generosity and assistance from our partners, The Mount and **Berkshire Natural Resources Council**, this access will be allowed in perpetuity and the 70 acres will remain in their natural state.

# GIFTS OF SANCTUARY LANDS

CARROLL SCHOOL Lincoln 85 acres Drumlin Farm

This property, which abuts Drumlin Farm Wildlife Sanctuary, was donated by **The Carroll School**. The land is predominantly red maple swamp, and is ideal habitat for a wide variety of plants and animals including two types of orchids—downy rattlesnake plantain and pink lady's slipper. It connects to a much larger network of protected land and hiking trails. Thanks also to the **Lincoln Land Conservation Trust**, which played a key role in this outcome.

PONZECCHI – COPICUT NECK Gosnold

29.5 acres

**Cuttyhunk Thicket** 

This Cuttyhunk Island property was part of a bequest from Muriel Ponzecchi. The land has more than a mile of coastline and is critical habitat for shorebirds and other coastal plants and wildlife. Its protection helps blunt the impacts of future coastal storm surge.

PONZECCHI - BUNKER HILL

**Cuttyhunk Thicket** 

This Cuttyhunk Island property was also part of a bequest from **Muriel Ponzecchi**. It is located at one of the highest points on the island and boasts a spectacular panoramic view of Buzzards Bay.

JOE WRIGHT BROOK BUFFER Whately

50 acres Graves Farm

This generous donation, located near Graves Farm Wildlife Sanctuary, is entirely forested with a mixture of hardwoods,

hemlock, and white pine. It is part of a larger network of protected, connected land, with a private CR to the north and west, Mass Department of Fish & Game land to the northeast, and City of Northampton watershed lands beyond that.

EAST BROOK BUFFER

7 acres Laughing Brook

Hampden

This land, which abuts Laughing Brook Wildlife Sanctuary, provides an important buffer between a residential neighborhood and a nature trail. It also expands the area protected by the sanctuary, providing additional critical

habitat for rare and endangered species.

7 acres Eagle Lake

This forested property was an inholding located in the middle of our Eagle Lake Wildlife Sanctuary. Mass Audubon approached the landowner, **UMass Memorial Realty**, about donating the property, and the company agreed. The property, forested with oaks, white pine, and red maple, bolsters the ecological integrity of the property and provides buffer to the adjacent residential area.

OLSON

5 acres

Princeton

**Wachusett Meadow** 

This property was donated by **Scott and Gladys Olson**, and owned by Scott's family for almost 40 years. It abuts the western boundary of our Wachusett Meadow Wildlife Sanctuary and protects the tranquil nature of nearby trails, including a section of the Midstate Trail, a popular long-distance hiking path stretching from Rhode Island to New Hampshire.

# **PURCHASES OF SANCTUARY LANDS**

SACRED HEARTS 110 acres Wareham Great Neck

This high-quality inland and coastal habitat at Great Neck Wildlife Sanctuary contains a future salt marsh adaptation zone and boasts more than one mile of frontage on Buzzards Bay. Mass Audubon had a Right of First Refusal (ROFR) on the entire property, thanks to our work to acquire a CR on much of the land in 2010. At the end of 2018 that ROFR was triggered, and an extremely fast and generous mobilization by the neighbors and other contributors enabled this purchase.

SINGLER 5.7 Northampton Arcadia

Working in partnership with the **City of Northampton**, these acres (state-designated as "Critical Natural Landscape and Core Habitat") were added to Arcadia Wildlife Sanctuary. The property is strategically located along the eastern boundary of the Manhan Meadows and adds to the extensive wetland systems, grasslands, shrublands, and forest that make up the 730-acre sanctuary.

TAMBURRINI 147 acres
Warwick Brush Valley

This property is adjacent to the Warwick State Forest, and near to a CR we hold on 30-plus acres donated by **Nick Arguimbau** in 2004. Purchase of this property was made possible by Mr. Arguimbau's generosity, and it expands the protection of the beautiful Gales Brook by more than 5,000 feet.

TUREK 7.5 acres
Sandisfield Cold Brook

This property sits across the street from our 764-acre Cold Brook Wildlife Sanctuary. It also connects the sanctuary to a 173-acre parcel we are working hard to acquire.

TRIFILO 8.95 acres
Barre Cook's Canyon

This acquisition preserves an ecologically significant natural area adjacent to Cook's Canyon Wildlife Sanctuary. Galloway Brook, which runs along the southern boundary, is a tributary of the Prince River, a coldwater stream. This project increased the protected stream corridor by approximately 650 feet.

# PURCHASES OF CONSERVATION RESTRICTIONS

OPEN AND SHUT, LLC 1.57 acres
Northampton Arcadia

Mass Audubon entered into a partnership whereby the **City of Northampton** acquired the fee interest in the property and conveyed a CR to Mass Audubon. The property abuts the Rocky Hill Greenway and is adjacent to land over which Mass Audubon already holds a CR.
