Taking part in one of our programs allows your participants to gain an appreciation for and an awareness of the natural world and your connection to it.

### Fall in Massachusetts

Where do the animals go? Why do the leaves change? This program discusses what happens to animals and nature during the fall in Massachusetts. Learn why certain animals need leaf litter to survive, how are animals preparing for winter, fall migrations and more!

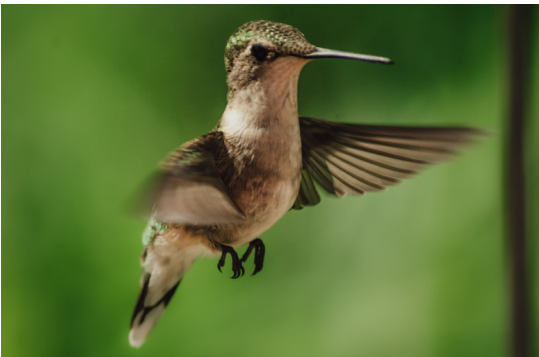
Meet with a Massachusetts Naturalists or biologist to discuss what you can do to protect animals this fall.



### Corvids of Massachusetts

Corvidae, Crows, Ravens, Blue Jays.... Why are they different from the other birds at our feeder? This program discusses why these birds are considered “intelligent” in the animal world. Learn about their behavior and habitats in this fun multimedia presentation. This presentation will also discuss some of the literature and art that surrounds these birds.

Meet with a Massachusetts Ornithologist and Corvid expert, discover why these birds are a focus in literature as an “omen” and what that means.



### Fall Migration

Many different factors effect when birds migrate in the fall. In this presentation we will discuss external and internal migratory cues birds use to determine when the time is right to move from their breeding range to their wintering range. Learn about some local species migration routes and behaviors, the impacts of climate change on migratory species, and visit with some live migratory bird of prey native to Massachusetts.

Meet with a Massachusetts Ornithologist who will teach about identifying birds and migratory species. Discover locations where migratory birds can be seen.



### Monarch Butterflies

During this program, you will learn about the exciting ways that monarch butterflies migrate thousands of miles each year. In this illustrated activity you will discover more about their unique ecology and adaptations from egg to adult. Discover the fascinating life-cycle of monarchs and their survival even in harsh conditions. Taught by a Mass Audubon Wildlife Biologist discover of world that exists right in your backyard
