## SEEKERS AWARD

### RULES AND CHECKLIST

**Objective:** Be the first team to find and identify all of the bird species on the Seekers Checklist.

**Rules Specific to the Seekers Competition:**

Teams must comply with all of the other Superbowl of Birding XVI rules with the following exceptions.

1. To win the Seekers Award, a team must be the first team to notify the Superbowl of Birding judges that they have completed the Seekers Award Checklist. If no team completes the Seekers Award Checklist, then the team that sees the most species on the checklist wins. In the event of a tie, the team that sees their last species earliest in the contest period wins. The telephone number for the Superbowl of Birding judges is 978-462-9998.
2. A team claiming the Seekers Award cannot win any other team award.
3. A member of a Seekers Award team is eligible for the Lifer Award.
